

A ONE-STOP-SHOP FOR HEALTH INFORMATION IN EUROPE

For the first time, catalogues of population health information sources from national and international organisations are findable through a single portal.

The Health Information Portal is a centralised one-stop shop, a library providing data catalogues on health and healthcare data, facilitating access and (re-)use of European data for policy making and research on the population health and healthcare systems.

On the Health Information Portal you can search:

NATIONAL NODES

National nodes are a core group of national institutions or governmental units functioning as a national liaison, bringing together relevant stakeholders in the field of health information.

For each country, users of the Health Information Portal can find:

- A general description of the national node: involved institutions, Ministries, key players in the field of health information, national data protection regulations, and information on health information infrastructure and management
- Health information sources for the country
- Different types of publications, including grey literature, on health information
- National health information projects
- Associations with different European Research Networks

EUROPEAN RESEARCH PROJECTS, NETWORKS AND INFRASTRUCTURES

- Health information research projects and initiatives within countries and across Europe
- A European Research Network is an active network of national and/or regional experts from several countries that perform comparative research in a specific health area (information domain).
- Research Infrastructures are facilities that provide resources and services for research communities to conduct research and foster innovation.

THE RAPID EXCHANGE FORUM

Within PHIRI, the Population Health Information Research Infrastructure, a Rapid Exchange Forum on COVID-19 involves research institutes, Ministries of Health, research institutes and universities as well as EU-level stakeholders, to answer questions and discuss national experiences related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This allows a rapid exchange of information across countries to learn from each other's challenges and best practices, on e.g. vaccination/testing/communication strategies, reaction to the pandemic, mortality indicators, long-term pandemic surveillance and impact evaluations of the pandemic. The answers to the questions discussed during the REF meetings are uploaded on the Health Information Portal

THE HEALTH INFORMATION PORTAL SUPPORTS THE FAIR PRINCIPLES

The FAIR data principles are international guidelines for research data management that aim to optimise the reuse of research data. This is achieved by making data:

FINDABLE, ACCESSIBLE, INTEROPERABLE, REUSABLE.



The European Health Information Portal uses metadata standards such as DDI (Data Documentation Initiative), Schema.org @dataset and W3C Data Catalog (DCAT) rdflib vocabulary for its catalogues.
